Limon School District is deservedly known as "The Power of the Plains", having amassed an impressive list of achievements in athletics, the arts, and academics. Limon has won 52 State Championship Team Trophies, including 17 state titles in Football, a Colorado record. Additionally, Limon students have accounted for 144 individual state championship honors in Boys' and Girls' Track, Wrestling, and Speech. Limon Athletic programs have also been a four-time recipient of the Wells Fargo Cup, also a state record. Limon won CHSAA's Sportsmanship Class 2A State Championship for the 2001-02 school year. Limon's instrumental band program has received Superior 1 ratings nearly 90% of the time over the past 40 years and has placed several students annually in the All State Band. Similarly, Limon's Choir program has landed 25 students in the All State Choir over the years and wows the audiences at Limon's annual Spring Musicales. The Limon Music Department coordinates and hosts multiple State and regional honor events such as: Honor Choir, Honor Band, All State Band Auditions, State Solo and Ensemble Contest, State Large Group Contest. In addition to producing four Boettcher Scholars and sixteen NEWS 4 Academic Team Champions, Limon grooms its academic talent with Brain Drain Club, Destination Imagination, and the Rocky Mountain Talent Search, where top finishes and large numbers of individual qualifiers keep Limon's tremendous tradition alive and thriving.

## Limon Public School

Limon Elementary School opened in 1889 and Limon High School was first constructed in 1912. The Junior High/High School has an enrollment of 270 students. The Elementary School (PK-5) enrollment is 190. The enrollment for the district is 461.

## Community Information

Limon is a rural community with a population of 2,200 located 87 miles east of Denver on I-70. Due to the Limon intersection of many highways near the town limits, Limon is known as the "Hub City". The Limon community is supported by the following industries: State Department of Corrections, Lincoln Community Hospital, Colorado State Patrol, Mountain View Electric, agriculture, and several service-oriented businesses.

## Curriculum Features

Limon offers a college preparatory program including English, Math, Social Studies, and Science classes at all levels. The school offers specialty elective classes in Industrial Arts, Fine Arts, Accounting, Spanish, French, Newspaper, Band, and Choir.
